














# FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO MAKE YOUR OWN SILLY SKELETON PAPER CHAIN!

- . Fold this piece of paper along the dotted blue lines to make a paper concertina, with the skeleton shapes on the outside
  - 2. Holding the concertina shut, cut along the red dotted lines, making sure that it cuts through all of the layers of paper
    - 3. Unfold your concertina to reveal your skeleton paper chain
      - 4. Repeat and glue together to make a longer chain!





## FOUR SILLY SKELETONS party games



### SILLY SKELETON MUSICAL STATUES

Put on some spooky music and dance the silly skeleton way! Tap your toes. knock your knees and flap your funny bones ... Then when the music stops, stand as still as possible. The last one to stand still - or the first one to move - is out of the game. Repeat until there's a winner!



### HEADS, SHOULDERS, KNEES AND TOES

Get familiar with your own silly skeleton by playing heads, shoulders, knees and toes. This will be even more fun if you're dressed as a skeleton yourself!

### PIN THE SKULL ON THE SKELETON

Create a skeleton drawing on a large piece of paper, minus the head. Draw the head on a separate piece of paper with a piece of adhesive tack on the back. Blindfold each child in turn, spin them around three times and then get them to try to stick the skull in the correct place. Mark each attempt with a cross on the piece of paper. The closest one wins!
