


## Lovereading4kids Reader reviews of **The 13-Storey Treehouse** by Andy Griffiths & Terry Denton

It also encourages visual literacy as kids can spend hours poring over the pages of detailed illustrations as well as younger readers using the plentiful simpler illustrations to help them to understand the text.
