



Rose's fondness for Argyle forces her to take action, regardless of the possible and likely dangers she will face. As the amateur sleuth sets out on her investigation, she discovers a world of grave-diggers, suspicious characters, magic and a secret butlers academy, that is hidden in a network of passages beneath York. **There is a mix of light and dark moments in this book that together make it a fascinating read and there is a great combination of characters**, including Rose's Gothic friend, Emily. I'm hoping this will be the first book in a series which I'll really look forward to reading.
