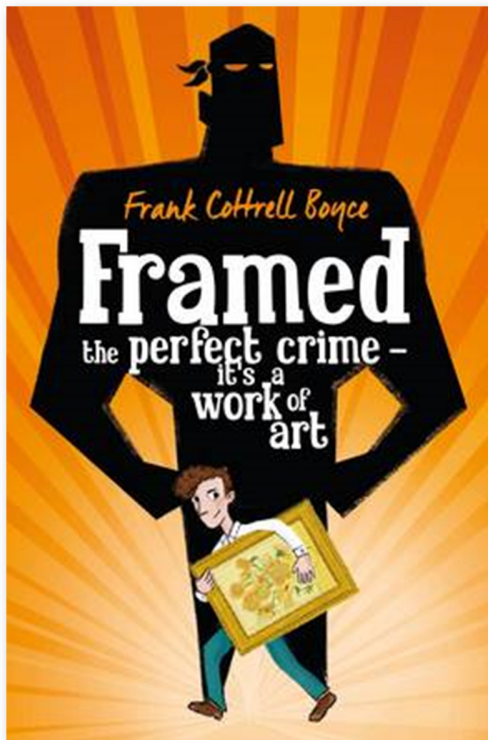


LoveReading4kids Reader reviews of **Framed** by Frank Cottrell Boyce
