A powerful, feminist read which will have you laughing out loud as tears slowly fall down your face. Absolutely brilliant.

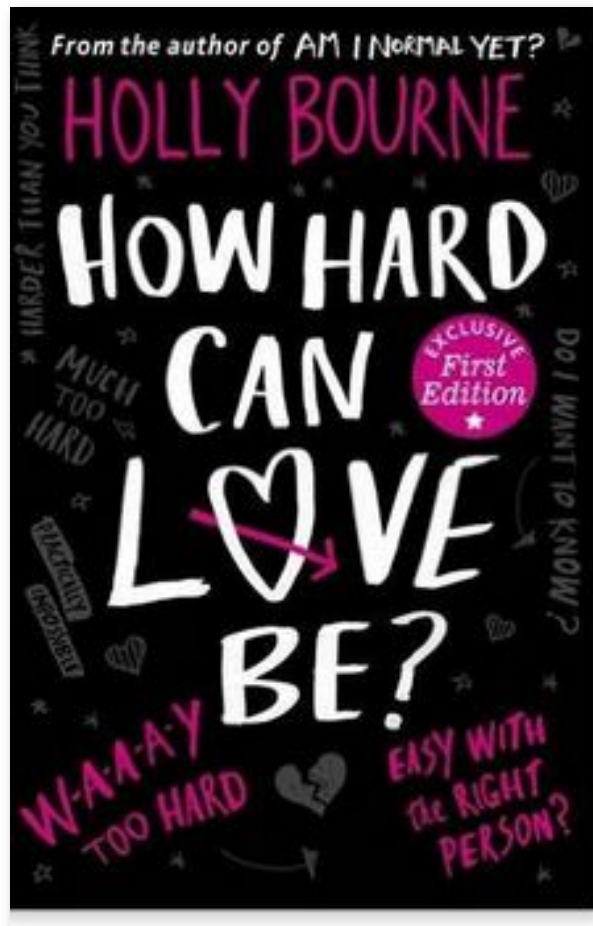
This book is phenomenal. In all honesty, I expected it to be phenomenal because all of Holly Bourne's books are, but she definitely doesn't disappoint.
