


LoveReading4kids Reader reviews of **The What On Earth Timeline Collection** By Christopher Lloyd and Illustrated by Andy Forshaw

There are six books in this series and each book is made up of a two metre timeline and informative newspaper cuttings. The book gives you lots of interesting facts and can help you learn whilst having fun. It also has a quiz and crossword at the back to test your knowledge. This is one of my favourite parts of the book!

Great illustrations and a cool magnifying glass mean you can 'zoom in' on interesting details, whilst still seeing how they fit in with the rest of history.

Great to see things laid out in chronological order - often just see things in snippets without knowing the historical context. Harry really likes the magnifying glass which allows you to literally 'zoom in' on anything interesting. I'm not sure how long they will last though - maybe attaching them by a ribbon to the book so they could also be used as a bookmark may be a good idea.

Liked the brilliant illustrations plus the useful indicators of where linked to e.g. National Trust sites - it's useful without being too overt.

Found the books to be a useful stepping stone to finding out more -if see something interesting, then can go and do more research. The letters pages at the back were entertaining and a useful way of starting discussions about differing points of view.
