


Helping you choose the best books for children

We were very pleasantly surprised when we received this book. I clearly hadn't paid much attention when putting us forward for it, as to what book it was. So when we opened it and saw it was one of the early colour readers, we were thrilled. My daughter, who's 5, has just started a collection of these and we have a few already so it was lovely to add to another.

This story is about The Little Princess (from the TV show) and now that she's a little older, people can't keep calling her Little Princess anymore. But her real name is horrible, so nobody wants to tell her because as you'll know if you've seen the show, the Little Princess, is rather naughty, and when she gets cross, she's very shouty! Will the Little Princess ever find out her name, and what will she do when she does?

These early colour readers are fab for when your child wants to progress to bigger books with a bit more depth, but haven't yet got the concentration for an older book. They have a few chapters with pictures on each page to keep them interested, and they are the sort of books you can either read in one sitting, if your child will sit for that long or read a few chapters before bed, and pick up where you left off the following evening. My 5 year old isn't happy unless you've read the whole book, and isn't squirming and fidgeting half way through because she's bored, so for us they're just the right length. I think it helps that as I say, she already knows the characters from the tv show, we also have a few of the Horrid Henry ones, which she loves, so their interest is already piqued.
