


# LoveReading Reader reviews of The Year That Changed Everything

*Ginger is turning 30. On her 30th birthday she is celebrating a friend's wedding when she overhears a conversation that will make her question her whole being.*

*The Year that Changed Everything is a story of women coping, coping with what the world is throwing at them and although they don't think they will come out of it the other side – they manage to with the support of family and friends.*
