

An exciting book with an unusual yet clever style of writing. It is action-packed and kept me gripped and engaged throughout.

'The Otherlife' is a cleverly written book, engaging me from start to finish. It is about a boy named Ben who can see the Otherlife, which is a bit like a parallel universe consisting of colours representing the Norse Gods. Ben befriends Hobie, who is intrigued by the Otherlife and wants to, just like Ben, look into the Otherlife and have a wolf tattoo on his hip. Despite Ben's divorced parents and poor life compared to Hobie's rich life, they become best friends. However, when Ben is told that his favourite tutor, Jason, died several years ago when he was at Hobie's country house, he sets out to find out what caused his unexpected death.

I liked both the style of writing and storyline itself. There are chapters but they are different to all other books – half the book is written by Ben and it is in the present whereas the other half is written by Hobie in the past; they are excerpts from his diary. These are alternate. This is clever as it gives clues so as to what events will unfold. At one point of the book, near the end, I didn't quite understand what was taking place however I soon found out, much to my disbelief, it was the sad ending of the book. I would highly recommend this book as the tension constantly builds up and the end is action-packed yet sad at the same time. It was a great read which kept me gripped throughout.
